

AHC30122 - Certificate III in Agriculture

Qualification description

This qualification describes the skills and knowledge for general job roles in agriculture including livestock production. Individuals with this qualification perform tasks under broad supervision involving a broad range of skills that are applied in a wide variety of contexts, which will involve discretion and judgement in selecting and operating equipment, coordinating resources and applying contingency measures during work.

Entry requirements

There are no entry requirements for this qualification.

Duration and location

This is a two-year course delivered in Years 11 and 12 online at CTSDE.

Course units

To attain a AHC30122 Certificate III in Agriculture, 16 units of competency must be achieved:

RTO obligation

The RTO guarantees that the student will be provided with every opportunity to complete the qualification. We do not guarantee employment upon completion of this qualification.

Students who are deemed competent in all 16 units of competency will be awarded a Qualification and a Record of Results.

Students who achieve at least one unit of competency (but not the full qualification) will receive a Statement of Attainment.

Delivery modes

A range of delivery modes will be used during the teaching and learning of this qualification. These include:

- face-to-face instruction
- work-based learning
- guided learning
- online training.

Fees

\$800 for full course. This cost includes the 5-day practical training and assessment activity.

Students are required to complete 160 hours of work placement. Any costs incurred during completion of work placement will be at the student's expense

Assessment

The mode of delivery includes any combination of the following:

- face-to-face in a simulated workplace environment for required performance and knowledge evidence
- work experience in commercial work site — third party report
- online for some components of training for knowledge evidence
- in a classroom ('off the job') for some components of training for knowledge evidence.

Work placement

Students are required to undertake 160 hours of work placement during the course in an agricultural environment. Attendance is also mandatory at a 5-day practical training and assessment activity, 'live in' arrangement.

A student is not eligible for a Statement of Attainment for any units until they have completed the 5 day practical.

Pathways

Successful completion of this course will qualify you to work in a diverse range of settings as a farmhand in the agricultural industry. You will also have a solid foundation to continue with further study.

This qualification may articulate into:

- Certificate IV in Agriculture
- Diploma of Agriculture
- Agricultural Science Degrees
